Update on COVID-19 response

Date: November 15<sup>th</sup> 2020

In the last 24 hours, the Public Health Laboratory (n=445/1), Nimule (40/1) Bentiu (n=0), Wau (n=0) Bor Hospital (n=0) Malakal (n=0) Torit (0/0), Rumbek (n=0), Kapoeta(n= 0),Yirol(n=0)Tonj (n=0), Abyei (n=0) and the UN Clinic (n=0) tested 495 samples and released results. Of these, 1 tested positive for COVID19.

Continue to observe the instructions of Health Authorities particularly washing hands regularly with water and soap; maintaining physical distance from other people (at least keep 2 meters (6 feet) distance between two individuals) and mandatory facemask or cloth face coverings in public.
