Update on COVID-19 response

Date: July 1st 2021

Of these, **5 tested positives** for COVID-19.

The Ministry of Health is conducting tracing of individuals who had contact with the COVID19 cases. The government urges the public to strictly observe the rules of social distancing and other public health measures declared by the **President of the Republic of South Sudan and High Level Task-Force**. Report any suspected case to nearest health facility or call to **toll free number: 6666**. Continue to observe the instructions of Health Authorities particularly washing hands regularly with water and soap; maintaining physical distance from other people (at least keep 2 meters (6 feet) distance between two individuals) and mandatory facemask or cloth face coverings in public.

Note: There were 15 cases from Western Equatoria added to the cumulative number of cases confirmed to date and reported today as backlog cases of 18th May to 30th June 2021.

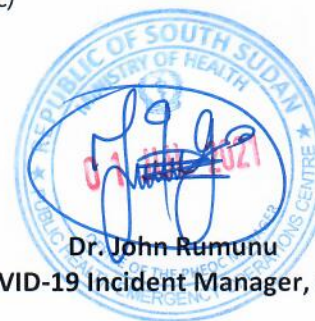
