Update on COVID-19 response

Date: 6th August, 2020

In the last 24 hours, the Public Health Laboratory (n=182/4), Nimule (n=22/1), Bor Hospital (n=0) and the UN Clinic (n=0) tested 204 samples and released results. Of these, 5 tested positive for COVID19.

Continue to observe the instructions of Health Authorities particularly washing hands regularly with water and soap; maintaining physical distance from other people (at least keep 2 meters (6 feet) distance between two individuals) and mandatory facemask or cloth face coverings in public.
