Update on COVID-19 response

Date: February 25th 2021

In the last 24 hours, the Public Health Laboratory (n=289/34), Nimule (n=0), Bentiu (n=11/9), Wau (n=0) Bor Hospital (n=0) Malakal (n=0) Torit (n=0), Kapoeta (n=0), Maban (n=0), Rumbek (n=0), Nzara(n= 2), Aweil(n=1),Yambio (n=0), Yirol(n=0),Nyirol(n=3),MakPandu(n=9),Tonj (n=0), Abyei (n=0), Ruweng (n=0), UN Clinic (n=3),Med Blue(n=575/146) , Queen Medical complex(n=290/59) , Nojum (n=0), Lakien (n=0), UNMISS (n=0) and Yei (n=0) tested **1,172** samples and released results. Of these, **248 tested** positive for COVID-19.

Continue to observe the instructions of Health Authorities particularly washing hands regularly with water and soap; maintaining physical distance from other people (at least keep 2 meters (6 feet) distance between two individuals) and mandatory facemask or cloth face coverings in public.
