Update on COVID-19 response

Date: February 23rd 2021

In the last 24 hours, the Public Health Laboratory (n=194/46), Nimule (n=0), Bentiu (n=0), Wau (n=0) Bor Hospital (n=10/1) Malakal (n=0) Torit (n=9), Kapoeta (n=0), Maban (n=0), Rumbek (n=0), Nzara(n= 0), Yambio (n=6), Yirol(n=0),Tonj (n=0), Abyei (n=0), Ruweng (n=0), UN Clinic (n=0),Med Blue(n=505/72) , Queen Medical complex(n=0), Nojum (n=35/7), Lakiem (n=0), UNMISS (n=0) and Yei (n=0) tested **759** samples and released results. Of these, **126 tested** positive for COVID-19.
