Update on COVID-19 response

Date: February 19th 2021

In the last 24 hours, the Public Health Laboratory (n=357/39), Nimule (n=0), Bentiu (n=0), Wau (n=0) Bor Hospital (n=0) Malakal (n=0) Torit (n=0), Kapoeta (n=0), Maban (n=0), Rumbek (n=0), Nzara (n=0), Yambio (n=0), Yiro (n=0), Tonj (n=0), Abyei (n=0), Ruweng (n=0), UN Clinic (n=0), Med Blue (n=490/97), Queen Medical complex (n=0), Nojum (n=25/4), Lakien (n=0), UNMISS (n=0) and Yei (n=0) tested **872** samples and released results. Of these, **150** tested positive for COVID-19.

Continue to observe the instructions of Health Authorities particularly washing hands regularly with water and soap; maintaining physical distance from other people (at least keep 2 meters (6 feet) distance between two individuals) and mandatory facemask or cloth face coverings in public.
