In the last 24 hours, the Public Health Laboratory (n=79/2), Nimule (n=31/1), Bentiu (n=3), Wau (n=0) Bor Hospital (n=0) Malakal (n=0) Torit (n=5), Rumbek (n=0), Nzara(n= 0), Yirol(n=0), Tonj (n=0), Abyei (n=0), Ruweng (n=0) and the UN Clinic (n=0), Med Blue(n=289/8) tested 407 samples and released results. Of these, 11 tested positive for COVID-19.
