Update on COVID-19 response

Date: January 27th 2021

In the last 24 hours, the Public Health Laboratory (n=121/3), Nimule (n=0) , Bentiu (n=0), Wau (n=0) Bor Hospital (n=0) Malakal (n=0) Torit (n=0), Rumbek (n=0), Nzara(n=0), Yirol(n=0), Tonj (n=0), Abyei (n=0), Ruweng (n=0) and the UN Clinic (n=0), Med Blue(n=282/11), Queen Medical complex(n=71/3) tested 474 samples and released results. Of these, 16 tested positive for COVID-19.
