Update on COVID-19 response

Date: October 30th, 2020

In the last 24 hours, the Public Health Laboratory (n=516/5), Nimule (n=0), Bentiu (n=0), Wau (n=3) Bor Hospital (n=0) Malakal (n=0) Torit (n=1), Rumbek (n=0), Tonj (n=0) and the UN Clinic (n=2/1) tested 522 samples and released results. Of these, 6 tested positive for COVID19.

In the last 24 hours, the Public Health Laboratory (n=766/1), Nimule (n=48/1), Bentiu (n=0), Wau (n=0) Bor Hospital (n=0) Malakal (n=0) Torit (n=0), Rumbek (n=0), Tonj (n=0) and the UN Clinic (n=0) tested 814 samples and released results. Of these, 2 tested positive for COVID19.
