Update on COVID-19 response

Date: 25th April 2020

In the last 24 hours, 77 samples were tested and results released. However, 238 samples are still pending. Of these tested samples, one individual was newly identified to be infected with COVID19. The new case identified is from South Sudan and the detail is as follows.
